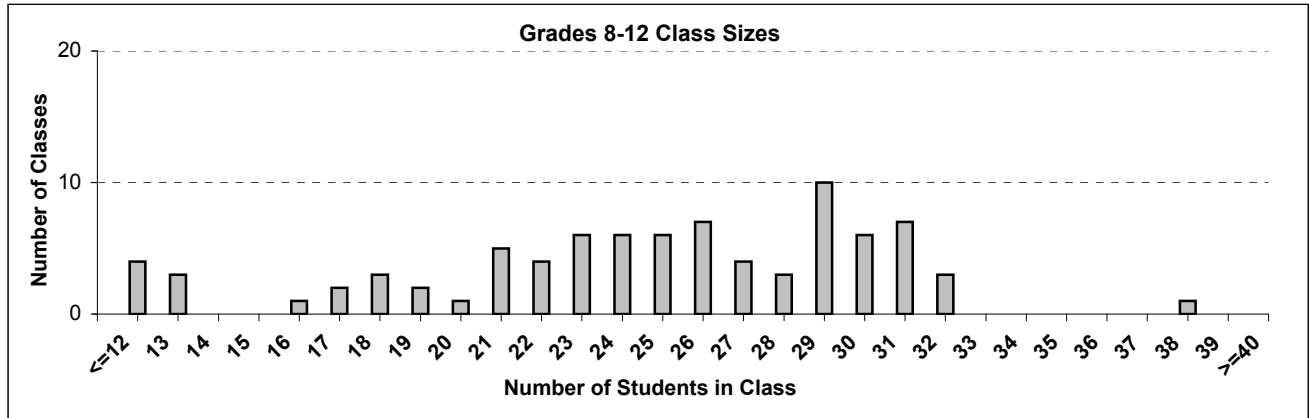

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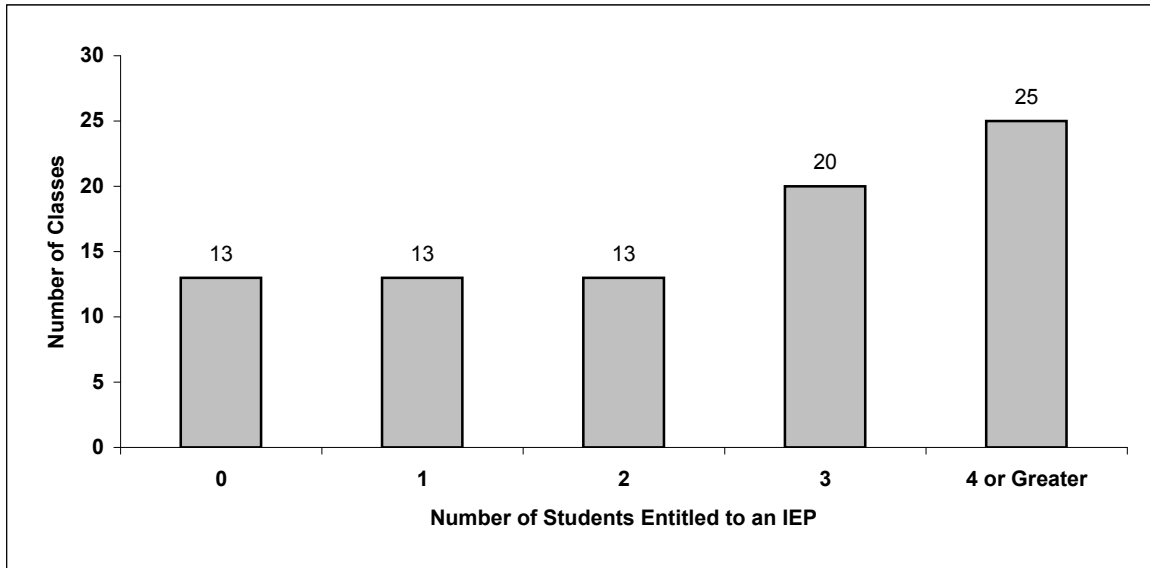

Grades 4-12 - Number of Classes in School with 'X' Number of Students Entitled to an IEP

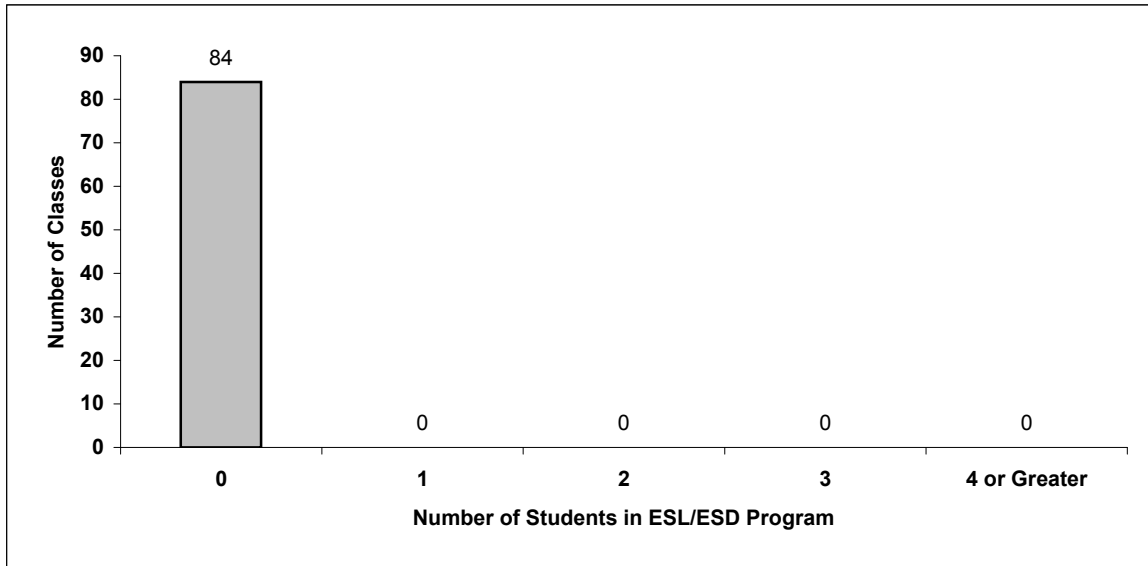


Students in English as a Second Language/Dialect (ESL/ESD) Program

Glossary

Terms	Definitions / Notes
Average Education Assistants Hours per Week	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The average number of Education Assistant (EA) hours per week, per class, at this school. Minutes are reported to two decimal points; for example, 1 hour 30 minutes is reported as 1.50 hours.
English as a Second Language/Dialect (ESL/ESD) Program	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> A program offered to students whose primary language(s) is/are other than English, and who may require additional services.
Gifted Student	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> A student who has exceptional gifts or talents and is defined as Category P in the Special Education Performance Reporting Groups.
Grade	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The assigned grade of a student on September 30.
KH	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Kindergarten half-time
KF	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Kindergarten full-time
Number of Students	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Student population is calculated by headcount.
Student	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> A person enrolled in a BC school. Student populations are calculated by headcount. Students include all adult and school-aged persons who are working toward a certificate of graduation.
Student Entitled to an Individual Education Plan	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> A student for whom an Individual Education Plan (IEP) must be designed under the Individual Education Plan order, Ministerial Order 638/95.
